




The students (in groups of four) participated in the "United States Constitution Scavenger Hunt." There were two students monitoring the groups so that they were within the guideline of the scavenger hunt. The group pictured to the right was the winner who found the most answers.

Books were borrowed from the students' U.S. History teacher for each group to use.



The scavenger hunt consisted of the following;

- What was the first constitution written by the 13 original colonies?
- When was the United States Constitution signed?
- How many delegates actually signed the Constitution?
- How many words are in the Constitution?
- Who were the only two presidents to sign the Constitution?
- Which 3 freedoms does the first amendment give us?
- What does the preamble of the Constitution state?



The students were excited and learned many facts about the Constitution in which they did not already know.
